


Cancer remains the leading cause of death in Canada, affecting nearly one in two Canadians over their lifetime. Nearly 45% of Canadians are expected to be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime, representing approximately 247,100 new cases in 2024.





Fundamental Research

Clinical Research

EVALUATION COMMITTEES

Evaluating Research Excellence

CRS is dedicated to funding high-quality research into all types of cancer, in order to better prevent, detect and treat this disease. We are committed to ensure that every donation received has a significant impact on cancer research.

CRS implements a meticulous peer-review process for each program to determine which research projects will receive funding. Each year, nearly 100 researchers, clinicians, and doctors rigorously and voluntarily evaluate the submitted grant applications. This thorough process ensures that funded research projects are carefully selected based on their relevance, feasibility, and potential to advance cancer knowledge.

ANNUAL Programs

Driving Cancer Advancements

To effectively support cancer research in Canada, CRS has established several annual grant programs. These programs aim to fund promising projects and help the entire scientific community overcome the funding challenges it faces. They provide financial support for research projects conducted by scientists at all career stages - students, postdoctoral fellows, and established researchers - united by a common goal: the fight against cancer.

Researchers Operating Grants / \$125,000 over 2 years



The Operating Grants program is the cornerstone of our support for research on all types of cancer. By funding a diverse range of projects among the most promising in Canada, we maximize our impact in advancing knowledge in cancer prevention, detection, and treatment. Currently, 173 ongoing grants are supporting innovative projects that are driving these advancements forward.

Postdoctoral fellows Next Generation of Scientists Awards / \$175,000 over 3 years

The Next Generation of Scientists Awards program, unique in Canada, supports the most promising postdoctoral fellows in establishing their laboratories and leading their own cancer research projects. Serving as a true springboard for launching their careers, this program actively contributes to the training of the next generation of cancer researchers in Canada. With awards spanning 3 years, 13 recipients are currently benefiting from this crucial support at this important stage of their careers.

Doctoral students Doctoral Research Awards / \$70,000 over 2 years



The Doctoral Research Awards program aims to support and encourage doctoral students conducting cancer research at Canadian universities. The scholarships provided allow them to focus exclusively on their research, offering essential financial support for their scientific training. Launched for the first time this year, the program received an impressive 170 applications from students across Canada!

Together, these programs play a central role in driving new cancer discoveries and developing the next generation of researchers in Canada.

Empowering Research: Essential Funding Increases

The recent increases in the stipend of our Operating Grants and Next Generation of Scientists Awards reflect our determination to addressing the urgent needs of the research community. Each grant in these two programs has been raised by \$5,000 compared to last year, an essential step to ensure researchers have the necessary resources to carry out their work effectively. This increase not only recognizes the rising costs of research but also provides essential support for advancing innovative cancer studies. We are pleased to announce that this increase will be renewed for coming year!

TARGETED PROGRAMS

Creating New Initiatives to Outsmart Cancer

Through partnerships, major donations, and various initiatives, CRS occasionally launches targeted programs to provide grants in specific research areas, such as certain rare or particular types of cancer.

ST COP	Grants for Ovarian Cancer Treatments: Bridging the Gap	Each year, approximately 3,100 Canadian women are diagnosed with ovarian cancer. Unfortunately, current treatments are often insufficient. This year, CRS partnered with Ovarian Cancer Canada to support translational research projects aimed at prolonging survival and improving quality of life for women affected by this disease. An investment of \$1.8 million has been allocated to three projects, offering new hope for patients.
	Translational Research Grants for Lung Cancer	In Canada, lung cancer remains the leading cause of cancer-related deaths, yet it is one of the most underfunded areas of research. To address this challenge, CRS launched this targeted program that provides a total of \$2 million in funding for four translational research projects. This significant investment is made possible thanks to the exceptional generosity of donors, including the Gosselin Family Foundation, the Molson Foundation, and the George Papadopoulos Memorial Fund.
	First International Partnership	This year, CRS established a groundbreaking international partnership with the British charity Worldwide Cancer Research (WCR). If a Canadian cancer research project is selected in WCR's 2024 grants competition, it will receive a remarkable grant of \$460,000 over three years, co-funded by our two organizations. This partnership opens new international funding opportunities for Canadian researchers, allowing them to conduct fundamental or translational research targeting cancer prevention, diagnosis, and treatment.

CLINICAL TRIALS

Innovating to Save Lives

While maintaining our focus on fundamental research, we have recently paved the way for researcher-led clinical trial funding. These trials test new treatments or interventions directly on patients, evaluating their effectiveness and safety before they become publicly available. By supporting these projects, we aim to provide new prospects for improved recovery outcomes and enhanced quality of life for cancer patients.

Currently, we are supporting **6 clinical trials**, each focused on different types of cancers. To give you a clearer overview, here is an update on our two most recently funded clinical trials.

Blood Cancer Clinical Trial

The GLIDE project, led by Dr. Denis-Claude Roy, is developing a cutting-edge technology to enhance bone marrow transplants for blood cancer treatment. This precision medicine approach aims to select and activate donor cells capable of recognizing and eliminating specifically cancer cells, multiply them in the laboratory, and then inject these cells into the patient. The goal is to reduce complications and improve treatment effectiveness. CRS is supporting this project with **\$1.5 million** in funding, thanks to the generosity of Mr. Herbert Black and Mr. Ronald Black.

Clinical Trial for Brain Cancer in Children

This project focuses on evaluating a care protocol to reduce radiation exposure in young children with rare embryonal brain tumours. Led by Dr. Annie Huang, it involves the direct and precise administration of chemotherapy and additional treatments into the fluid surrounding the brain and spinal cord. This protocol offers hope for improving treatments for these children. The project is funded with **\$600,000** over four years through the DECRYPT grant, supported by CRS and six other partner organizations.
